Book Packs

In 2025, the supply of materials to the classroom will look a little different. Instead of parents paying a requisite fee and these bulk supplies being distributed in the classroom, families will order an individual book pack for each student at a cost of \$50 per pack. The school's choice of supplier is Kookaburra Educational Resources. There will be some variation between book pack contents depending on which year level your child is in for 2025.

How to order/pay for them- there will be a line in Compass that says 2025 Stationary & Book Pack. It will be found on Compass on the right-hand side under the Payments Centre tab.

When to pick books up- Friday 24th January or Tuesday 28th January 2025.

We will be sharing with families instructions on how to organise and name these items when you pick up your book pack. All items will be expected to be brought on the first school day of 2025.

Uniforms:

We have plenty of second hand uniforms available for families to collect prior to the end of the year. Please come into the library and go through the cupboards and take what you need. Additionally, you can order your uniforms through Bec and use the new school bonus to pay for them.

Headlice:

We have received reports of head lice cases. Please be vigilant in checking your children's hair for any signs of head lice. It's a good idea to keep special shampoo at home in case you need it. Ensure that your child brings their own hat to school and does not borrow hats from other children, as this will help prevent the spread of head lice. Please note, that if your child has long hair, tie it up every day. After treating with the special shampoo, children can return to school immediately.

I know that they get excited to tell us stories about where they've been and what they've done. I love that we can tell when something is up, that they allow themselves to be vulnerable and for themselves to be seen by Megan and I. We have seen all of them cry, more than once. They have seen me cry. We have heard them speak about how they feel with honesty and bravery. I wish you could all know them the way we do, and see how brilliantly they shine in my eyes, even on tough days.

Mostly I know that my classroom will never be the same. Cooper, Cade, Cameron, Larissa, Nate, and Brok, you have filled my days with joy and frustration, laughter and tears, excitement and despair, and a whole lot of admiration for the humans you are, and for who you will become.
